# 2017-18 Hebrew School Tuition Rates and Hebrew Tabernacle Community Policies

Your child is joining the Hebrew School community and you are also joining the Hebrew Tabernacle synagogue community as a family. Tuition pays only part of the Hebrew School's expenses with community dues and Hebrew School and synagogue fundraising making up the balance. We welcome you, as well as your children! As your child progresses in Hebrew School, we will be asking you to progress in your involvement and support of our synagogue.

No child will be barred from Hebrew School for a parent's inability to pay full tuition, and scholarships are available (see reverse side). It is also possible for membership dues to be adjusted, based on family finances, and there is also a new-member discount. However, students will not be able to attend if payments are not made according to the provisions of a payment plan to which parents have agreed.

Alternatively, for those able to pay the entire tuition amount sooner than 2/15/18, we'd greatly appreciate that as it will help us to meet our start-up expenses for the school year.

## FULL TUITION (including books and snacks)

<u>Aleph-Gimmel</u> Wednesdays Full tuition for students registering for the first time in any of these classes is \$450. For students who have registered before, the tuition is \$950 for members and \$1700 for non-members

Dalet-Zayin- Mondays-Full tuition for members is \$950,

At least one adult in the family must have joined as a member (more are welcome!) in order for students to enroll in these classes. <u>Hebrew High School</u>- At least one adult in the family must be a member (more are welcome!). Alternatively, a student can join as a student member for \$200. Tuition is \$350 for the year, including dinner before each class.
