### RABBI'S MESSAGE

**O**n September 12, 2015, my first novel, *The Ballad of East and West*, was officially published. It was inspired by a bat mitzvah of a Russian American teenager that took place at the Hebrew Tabernacle on May 31, 2014. Exactly thirty years ago, an English girl from London was "twinning" with a Russian girl from Leningrad. In both cases the Torah portion was *Parshat Naso*. My former student from London flew to New York and attended this special bat mitzvah. The ceremony generated such personal emotion that I was compelled to put down on paper what had been in my head for over thirty years. My novel begins with a rehearsal of the Russian American girl in the sanctuary of the fictitious congregation, *Rodef Tzedek*. The rest of the work is a flashback of the series of events which took place in 1984.

The theme of the book is best expressed by an excerpt of Martin Luther King's speech at East Berlin's Marienkirche which he delivered on September 13, 1964.

*May I say that it is indeed an honor to be in this city, which stands as a symbol of the divisions of men on the face of the earth. For here on either side of the wall are God's children, and no man-made barrier can obliterate that fact. Whether it be East or West, men and women search for meaning, hope for fulfillment, yearn for faith in something beyond themselves, and cry desperately for love and community to support them in this pilgrim journey.*

While most of *The Ballad of East and West* takes place during the Cold War and while I am primarily writing about refuseniks and my particular Jewish world, the theme is universal. It is not only about two Jewish girls living on opposite sides of the Iron Curtain and attempting to reach out to one another. It is not only a plea for detente between the American and Russian spheres of influence.

It is also a plea for greater understanding and empathy between peoples of diverse religious faiths, ethnicities, and cultures wherever they happen to live in the world. *The Ballad of East and West* could easily apply to east and west of Broadway in New York City or East and West Jerusalem. The message that comes out of the plight of Soviet Jewry is the same message that comes out of our ancestors' slavery in Egypt. Because our people has suffered oppression, we must love the stranger as we love ourselves.

Both my editor and a number of readers have pointed out to me that there are a lot of unresolved plots in *The Ballad of East and West*. They have become emotionally invested in some of the characters and want to know what happened to them. As I plan the sequel, I will resolve some of the story lines as well as raise the larger issues that come out

of the book.

In the middle of June, the Jewish world will be celebrating Shavuot—the season of the giving of our Torah. There is a midrash in which our Sages explain why the Torah was given in the wilderness, in no man's land, rather than in the land of Israel. They explain that God intended the Torah to be available to all people. They suggest that Torah is not just the private learning of the Jews. It is a wisdom for all peoples. Torah, like the wilderness itself, is universally accessible and has no borders.

The mission of the Jewish people is to be a "light unto the nations" and to share the insights of Torah with our neighbors. Thus, at Hebrew Tabernacle, we should take pride in the fact that we open our doors to the general community. Our synagogue is rapidly becoming a community center. In the words of *The Ballad of East and West*, "the language of love is the universal language."

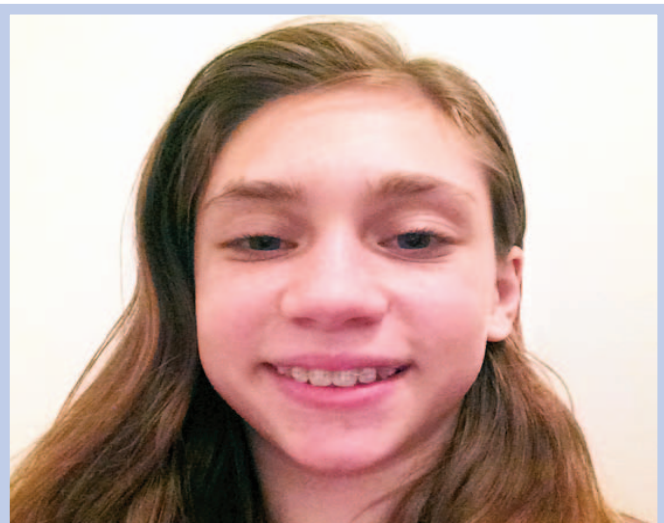

# Educational and Inspirational Services for the Whole Hebrew Tabernacle Family

On Friday, March 11, the Aleph Class of 5 and 6-year-olds shared with all of us from the bimah what they had learned about and loved about Shabbat. The sanctuary held Hebrew Tabernacle members and families of all ages. For me, it was moving to say Kaddish for my mother-in-law Anna Frank, Miriam's mom, because I know she was so happy that our daughter, Ruth, learned to love Judaism in this Hebrew School.

Before dinner, the Zayin class presented what they had learned from face-to-face conversations with rabbis from all the different movements in Judaism—Reform, Reconstructionist, Conservative and Orthodox. And the audience of kids and adults reflected with them on what they thought was important about these differences and also how the Torah binds all Jews together.

During the Family-Friendly Shabbat Service on Saturday, March 19, the Hebrew Tabernacle family shared a morning service with a separate adult discussion of the Megillah and kid discussion of the Torah portion. Rabbi Gale led an interesting dialogue about the link between Saul and the Amalekites and their respective descendants Mordechai/Esther and Haman and the ethical issue of dealing with your enemies—issues of defeat, retribution, reparations and reconciliation.

At the same time, Ruth Frank-Holcomb was leading a discussion with eight children on the parsha Va'yikrah which describes what offerings must be made to atone for inadvertent sins. Each of the children drew a picture with captions to show what they do when they have made a mistake and hurt someone else. Then they shared the pictures and the advice with the congregation: "Scream into your pillow. Then apologize." "Admit your mistake, then give them back what you took, or something similar." One student composed a little booklet: "How to apologize for dummies."
