RABBI'S MESSAGE

elf-criticism is certainly a part of the contemporary Jewish life, especially with regards to the ongoing Israeli-Palestinian conflict. To be sure, many Jews blame the conflict on the refusal of extremist groups to recognize Israel as a Jewish state, their desire to wipe Israel off the map, and the pervasiveness of terrorism. Many self-critical Israelis, especially those from the political left, blame the oppressiveness of the occupation in Gaza and the West Bank.

Shortly after the observance of Israel Independence Day, the reform Jewish world mourned a giant within our movement: Rabbi Robert Samuels. While Rabbi Samuels was critical of the Israeli government's treatment of both Palestinians and Israeli Arabs, he was far more than a mere complainer. Rabbi Samuels was an ardent Zionist in an age when Zionism was not fashionable within Hebrew Union College.

Born in Houston, Texas and ordained at the Cincinnati campus of Hebrew Union College in 1960, he and his wife made Aliyah in 1962. Rabbi Samuels was a star pitcher for the Brandeis University baseball team and was even scouted by major league teams, but he chose the much more difficult path of serving the Jewish state for most of his adult life.

He established two synagogues in Haifa, was one of the founding members of MARAM, the Israeli Council of Progressive Rabbis, and was an active member of the Jerusalem Board of Overseers. His greatest accomplishment was that of serving as headmaster of the Leo Baeck Education Center from 1974-1999. He transformed into one of the premier educational and cultural institutions in Israel.

Tikun olam and g'milut chasadim pervaded every fiber of Rabbi Samuels' being. He and his wife, Annette, adopted families from the Ethiopian community, helping them survive bias and deprivation. He was beloved by the Druse and his outreach to his Arab neighbors offers a model for the future. Indeed, the Leo Baeck Community Centre is brimming with Israeli-Arab co-existence programs including an Israeli-Arab summer camp, an afternoon program for Israeli and Arab families at risk, and an annual summit for Israeli and Arab teenagers.

Somehow, it seems fitting that Rabbi Samuel's death took place just after the reading of Parshat Kedoshim. This Torah portion emphasizes that holiness is not confined to ritual observance. Holiness must also pervade in the realm of interpersonal relations. The key verses are the commandments to love our neighbors as ourselves and to particularly love the stranger or as we were strangers in the land of Egypt. As Rabbi Samuels writes:

Love is generated one person at a time, through empathy and caring. One life might seem pleasant, but in the long run, we cannot live a good life, if others do not. A strong democracy cannot survive when many of its people do not have a good life. We cannot have two parallel societies, one middle and upper class with enough material wealth, and another with not enough to have a basically healthy physical and spiritual life. Society must give opportunity to all to realize their dreams and have a decent life. It is this value that we must pass to those who follow us. Never be satisfied that you "have it all". There is no "all" until all others have a good life too.

We say in Hebrew, *zacheir tzadik livracha*. May Rabbi Robert Samuels' memory be for a blessing. May his idealism and tremendous accomplishments be an inspiration to all of us who walk in his footsteps.


