

2018-19 Hebrew School Tuition Rates and Hebrew Tabernacle Community Policies

Your child is joining the Hebrew School community and you are also joining the Hebrew Tabernacle synagogue community as a family. Tuition pays only part of the Hebrew School's expenses with community dues and Hebrew School and synagogue fundraising making up the balance. We welcome you, as well as your children! As your child progresses in Hebrew School, we will be asking you to progress in your involvement and support of our synagogue.

No child will be barred from Hebrew School for a parent's inability to pay full tuition, and scholarships are available (see reverse side). It is also possible for membership dues to be adjusted, based on family finances, and there is also a new-member discount. However, students will not be able to attend if payments are not made according to the provisions of a payment plan to which parents have agreed.

Alternatively, for those able to pay the entire tuition amount sooner than 2/15/19, we'd greatly appreciate that as it will help us to meet our start-up expenses for the school year.

STANDARD PAYMENT PLAN

Due on **August 15**, 2018- 25% Deposit

Due on **September 9**, 2018-Second payment- 25%.

Due on **December 15**, 2018- Third payment- 25%

Due on **February 15**, 2019- Final payment- 25%

Please note: If a family has unpaid tuition balances due from last year, we are not able to enroll children in the Hebrew School for this year until the past balance has been settled.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND ALTERNATIVE PAYMENT PLANS

They will send you an application for scholarship assistance and will discuss that--or your alternative full tuition payment plan proposal--with you.

All arrangements must be finalized **BEFORE** Hebrew School begins—by October 2nd so please contact one of them immediately.

Part of the process of arranging for tuition scholarships includes the expectation that parents commit to contribute some volunteer time in the Hebrew School or in the synagogue by doing such important tasks as shopping for snack supplies or helping out at community events such as the Friday Night Family Dinners or some other in-kind donation.

The HT Board Members and Shelly Koy coordinate these volunteer activities.
