2020/21 Hebrew School Tuition Rates and Hebrew Tabernacle Community Policies

Your child is joining the Hebrew School community and you are also joining the Hebrew Tabernacle synagogue community as a family. Tuition pays only part of the Hebrew School's expenses with community dues and Hebrew School and synagogue fundraising making up the balance. We welcome you, as well as your children! As your child progresses in Hebrew School, we will be asking you to progress in your involvement and support of our synagogue.

No child will be barred from Hebrew School for a parent's inability to pay full tuition, and scholarships are available. It is also possible for membership dues to be adjusted, based on family finances, and there is also a new-member discount. However, students will not be able to attend if payments are not made according to the provisions of a payment plan to which parents have agreed.

Alternatively, for those able to pay the entire tuition amount sooner than 2/15/19, we'd greatly appreciate that as it will help us to meet our start-up expenses for the school year.

Please note: If a family has unpaid tuition balances due from last year, we are not able to enroll children in the Hebrew School for this year until the past balance has been settled.
